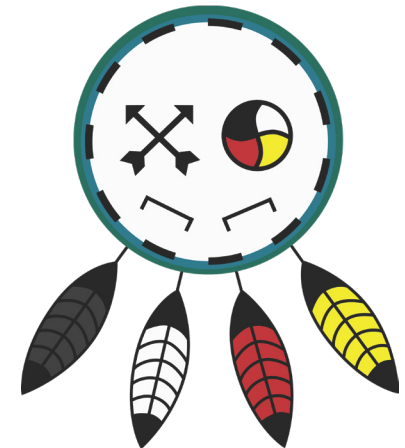

Objectives

To offer Housing services to address the needs of aboriginal homeless individuals, families who are chronically homeless or at risk of homelessness.

To improve the self-sufficiency of individuals: youth, elders, and families who are recently housed providing household supportive services.

To connect individuals to cultural/traditional activities to meet the client's needs or to reconnect individuals to cultural appropriate services/programming

To offer intervention/prevention services to indigenous homeless and those who are facing housing uncertainty.

Services and Programs

Service availability based on Individual Assessment and ability to live independently

Our services do not include Emergency housing/Shelter or immediate housing accommodations

- Advocacy
- Landlord/Tenant Mediation
- Intervention/Prevention
- Housing Search
- Rapid Rehousing
- Housing Services
 - Basic household necessities, furnishings (based on individual assessment)
- Informal Counseling (mental health & addiction referral)
- Cultural/Traditional Services (Smudging, Medicine, Teachings)
- Follow up
